This exercise will test your knowledge of those six most troublesome irregular verbs: <u>lie</u> and <u>lay</u>, <u>sit</u>, and <u>set</u>, <u>rise</u> and <u>raise</u>. Remember that <u>lie</u>, <u>sit</u>, and <u>rise</u> are intransitive. <u>Lay</u>, <u>set</u>, and <u>raise</u> are transitive and take an object.

Write the correct form or tense of the verb on the line.

- 1. The proposal we (lie, **lay**) <u>laid</u> out has (lie, **lay**) <u>lain</u> in his basket for two days.
- 2. The machinist had (lie, **lay**) **lain** the parts in the basket before he (**sit**, set) **sat** at his machine.
- 3. (Set, Sit) Sit down while I (set, sit) set this matter before you.
- 4. Many questions were (rise, **raise**) <u>raised</u> by the new employees as they (**sit**, set) <u>sat</u> in the orientation session.
- 5. The auditor (**rise**, raise) <u>rose</u> and (rise, raise) <u>raised</u> a question.
- 6. Once we had (sit, **set**) <u>set</u> the ground rules, we couldn't afford to (**sit**, set) <u>sit</u> still very long.
- 7. The decision to (rise, **raise**) **raise** prices again was made by the marketing department, in spite of the fact that they had been (rise, **raise**) **raised** 10% last year.
- 8. Keep (lie, **lay**) **laying** plans for the future.
- 9. Through his own hard work he (**rise**, raise) **rose** to a position of responsibility.
